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1. Principal's Address

5. Infrastructural Development

The college continues to strengthen its physical and academic infrastructure to support evolving educational needs and enhance the overall learning environment. This year marked significant progress in infrastructure development, with upgrades and new projects aimed at improving academic spaces, student facilities, and campus sustainability. During the previous academic year, the college undertook a series of transformative infrastructure projects aimed at enriching the educational ecosystem and improving accessibility.

The crowning moment in this journey was the visit of Prof. Yogesh Singh, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of the University of Delhi, along with other esteemed dignitaries such as Prof. Balaram Pani, Dean of Colleges, Prof. Shri Prakash Singh, Director South Campus, and Dr. Vikas Gupta, Registrar, DU, who honored the college with their presence on July 22, 2024, to inaugurate these projects. Their presence marked a moment of great pride and reaffirmed the college's commitment to excellence in higher education.

Among the most significant achievements was the reconstruction and beautification of the statue of Shaheed-e-Azam Bhagat Singh, symbolizing courage and idealism while serving as an inspiration for values such as national pride, courage, and a sense of purpose in service. Equally notable were several key additions aimed at improving accessibility and enhancing the institutional environment. Two new elevators were installed to ensure enhanced mobility for all members of the college community. All of these developments were conceived with a focus on inclusivity, aesthetics, functionality, collaboration, community engagement, and the overall well-being of both faculty members and students.

The college also took a monumental step forward by constructing a state-of-the-art open-air auditorium equipped with rock-wool insulation, providing a venue for academic and cultural events where optimal design, flexibility, efficiency, and sustainability are seamlessly integrated. The upgrading of seminar halls has significantly enhanced the academic infrastructure of the college. Several existing classrooms have been transformed into technology-enabled smart classrooms. These classrooms feature an auditorium-style or cavea-shaped layout designed to accommodate a hundred students. They are equipped with integrated digital infrastructure, including podium systems, LCD interactive panel, high-speed Wi-Fi, sound systems, and smart cameras. These initiatives have set new benchmarks in the college's journey toward digital empowerment and pedagogical innovation.

The inauguration of the Knowledge Dissemination Centre, "*Gyan Prasar Kendra*," (in the Day college, with facilities available for the evening college as well) represents a visionary leap toward democratizing access to quality education, offering online lectures, podcasts, and guidance and resources for competitive exam preparation to students across the country. Seeking to bridge the educational divide by leveraging technology to reach a wider student audience across the nation, Gyan Prasar Kendra, SBSC, maintains a dedicated YouTube channel, where students can access top-tier lectures by University of Delhi faculty, covering the regular college syllabi and competitive examinations such as UPSC-CSE and CUET-PG. The initiative also features podcasts with eminent personalities, offering insights that help students build confidence and clarity in their academic and professional pursuits. These initiatives reflect the college's belief in the words of Rabindranath Tagore: "Everything, including great education, that belongs to us comes to us if we create the capacity to receive it."


Building on the ethos and momentum of these developments, the college made another significant stride with the inauguration of the newly constructed state-of-the-art Academic Auditorium on 17th February 2025. With a seating capacity of 230, the auditorium marks a significant addition to the college's academic infrastructure. It includes features such as flexible seating arrangements, high-profile speakers, an elevated podium, powerful lighting, wall-mounted screens, wireless internet connectivity, enhanced accessibility through an inclined

platform lift for wheelchair users or individuals requiring mobility assistance, a well-designed green room, and an emergency exit. The auditorium was inaugurated by our esteemed Chief Guest, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi, Former Governor of Assam, Nagaland and Mizoram, and Former Minister of Finance, Excise, Taxation, and Higher Education, Government of Delhi, who congratulated the college for achieving this milestone and highlighted the significance of such spaces for enabling insightful conferences, interactions, collaboration, and discussions across academic fields and institutions.

In anticipation of the demands of the four-year undergraduate program envisioned under NEP 2020, the college has been working ceaselessly on creating more spaces for lectures, engagements, and activities for the enrichment of our students. We have made notable additions to our ever-expanding catalog of smart classrooms with interactive panels and other enhancements in rooms C6, C7, and C8 this year. Two air-conditioned Activity Rooms have been constructed on the third floor for facilitating interactions such as tutorials, meetings, discussions, and round-table seminars. For student safety and convenience, a dedicated pathway was designed to help students exit without navigating alongside the vehicles plying on campus. Subsequently, the college added warm-toned street lighting at strategic locations across the campus, ensuring that the campus and its pathways remain well-lit throughout the evening while also enhancing the campus's aesthetic appeal. The entire lighting system was designed and executed in-house by the college's staff. This marks a significant achievement in our journey toward self-sufficiency and innovation, showcasing how collaboration within the college leads to impactful improvements for the college community.

The project to set up an electric substation, envisioned to make all classrooms fully air-conditioned, is already complete. This, combined with structures like the newly installed shade canopy over the main entrance gate that shelters the area from hostile weather, will ensure that navigation, learning, and relaxation are equally comfortable for all college members across the campus. We have also ensured that the mental health and well-being of our students are addressed by creating a safe space with a college counsellor who is available for online as well as offline sessions for students who need counselling, guidance, or help with their health, stressors, goals and growth. Future and ongoing projects including the renovation of E-Block, the construction of a state-of-the-art Multipurpose Hall-cum-Sports Block, an ECA (Extra-Curricular Activities) Complex, and several new classrooms, the installation of digital display screens throughout the campus, floodlights for the college grounds, an air-conditioned canteen, and creation of well-equipped departmental rooms stand as a testament to the college's vision and forward-looking spirit.

With these initiatives that promise an overhaul of educational possibilities, the college continues to invest in infrastructure that reflects its academic aspirations and the holistic development of its students. These historical milestones together mark an ongoing chapter in the college's pursuit of creating an environment where knowledge thrives and future leaders are shaped, in keeping with an ethos summarised by Abraham Lincoln when he famously announced: "The best way to predict your future is to create it".



6. ERP Portal

ERP portal of the college was launched in 2023-24 with great pride and enthusiasm. It was introduced with features of online attendance, course management and student information system. The Chief Guest as well as speaker for the occasion was Padma Shri (Prof.) J. S. Rajput who is an eminent educationist, thinker and Former Director NCERT. Dr. Sarad Kumar Yadav (Secretary, Staff Council) welcomed all present, and described the significance of Bhagat Singh as a youth icon, and his supreme sacrifice as a profound contribution towards social justice and nation building.

II. Department of Economics

The Department of Economics has formed the Economics Society, where the department teachers play an integral role in its functioning and growth, along with the students working under their guidance. The members of the society actively seek the guidance of the faculty to organize various academic as well as extra-curricular events (inter college as well as intra college). The Economics Society has framed itself as one of the admirable fellowships of Shaheed Bhagat Singh Evening College, and is recognised as a high yielding ground for academic as well as co-curricular growth. The Economics Society under Convenor Dr. Ruma Kumari and Teacher-in-charge, Mr. Lakshmi Kant has been actively involved in organising Lectures and its annual fest Ecobuzz (inter-college) and its flagship event NYEC (National Young Economists Conclave) to make the subject of economics more interesting for the students in the year 2024-2025.

The various activities undertaken by the Department of Economics in 2024-25 are as follows:

1. Annual Fest - EcoBuzz 2024-2025

The Economics Society of Shaheed Bhagat Singh Evening College successfully hosted its annual event EcoBuzz 2024 (inter college) on November 12th, 2024. This year's edition continued the tradition of providing a dynamic platform not only for Delhi University students but also drawing participants from esteemed colleges across Delhi and Delhi NCR, functioning as a dynamic hub for intellectual exchange and the dissemination of knowledge, fostering engagement through a wide array of diverse and enriching activities that provided participants with the opportunity to showcase their analytical and problem-solving skills in the field of economics.



The event featured two flagship events:

- **Nitivimarsh: The Fiscal Policy Challenge**

Nitivimarsh challenged participants to develop realistic economic policy solutions for pressing global issues such as debt crisis management, hyperinflation control, unemployment, economic recession, infrastructure funding, and climate change adaptation.

Participants selected a country of their choice and crafted strategic fiscal, monetary, and policy-driven responses through engaging presentations. We received a total of 113 registrations, which were organized into 28 teams, out of which only 18 teams were finalized for the event day.

- **ECONOMANIA: The Eco-Maniac Challenge**

Economania was an exhilarating, multi-round competition designed to challenge participants on their knowledge of economic concepts, sharpen their critical thinking, and test their strategic decision-making skills. We were thrilled by the enthusiastic response, receiving as many as 162 registrations—a testament to the growing interest and engagement individuals—the true Ecomaniacs.



2. Workshop on “Research Methodology Workshop” Report

The Department of Economics, in collaboration with the Economics Society, successfully organized a Workshop on “Research Methodology for the Social Sciences” on 24th March 2025. The workshop was conducted by Professor Komol Singha, who is a distinguished professor at the Centre for Economic Studies and Planning at Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. He provided insightful perspectives on the fundamental principles of research in the social sciences. His session was both intellectually enriching and highly engaging, offering invaluable guidance particularly for students aspiring to pursue academic or applied research. The workshop not only deepened participants’ understanding of research design and methodology but also inspired critical thinking and scholarly inquiry.

3. 7th Edition National Young Economist Conclave

The National Young Economists Conclave, held on March 27, 2025, aimed to provide undergraduate students with a dynamic platform to showcase their research skills and analytical perspectives on pressing economic issues. Undergraduate students from recognized universities and institutes across India were invited to submit original research papers and present their insights on themes aligned with the core focus of the conclave. This annual event offered a vibrant platform for participants to explore economic theories, sharpen their research skills, and engage in innovative thinking through insightful presentations.



The National Young Economists Conclave (NYEC) witnessed an impressive turnout, with over 210 registrations from students across the country. Notable institutions represented included the University of Delhi, Christ University (Bangalore), Chandigarh University, and several others. In the preliminary round, we selected 100 abstract, out of which the research papers of 50 teams were selected and were advanced to the next round. On the final day of the event, only 30 teams were shortlisted to present their research papers.

The 7th edition of the National Young Economists Conclave transcended the bounds of competition, emerging as a true celebration of intellectual curiosity and academic excellence. The various activities undertaken by Carpe Diem: The English Literary and Language Society of the Department of English in 2024-25 are as under:


1. The inaugural event of the session was a guest lecture on the topic “Indian Knowledge System: Its Role and Goals in Modern Times” on 8th October 2024. The eminent speaker was Dr. Sanjay Verma, Associate Professor of English, Department of English, North Campus, University of Delhi. This event also saw the badge ceremony for the Carpe Diem office bearers: Ms. Sakshi Khatri (President), Ms. Riddhima (Vice President), Mr. Abhas Garg (Secretary), Ms. Disha Sahnii (Joint Secretary), Mr. Rishi Khinchi (Treasurer) and Mr. Divyansh Srivastava (IT Head).



In his address, Dr. Sanjay Verma spoke about the role and goals of Indian Knowledge Systems, starting from the Vedas, and integrating it with our current higher education systems. He explained that the Indian Knowledge System is a systematic and structured approach to transmitting knowledge from one generation to the next generation. In the course of his lecture, he addressed four crucial questions, what is Indian Knowledge System (IKS), why is IKS relevant, the role and goals of IKS in modern times, and can we call IKS as regaining the Indian ways of seeing and ways of being, with specific reference to Prof. Makarand Paranjpe's book, "Cultural Knowledge of India". Making a strong case for the inclusion and integration of IKS in the formal education system, Dr. Verma discussed how several world class universities were running in the country in ancient times, including Nalanda and Takshashila, and how post-independence, we became receivers of knowledge instead of generators and givers of the same. He referred to the importance given to knowledge in the Indic system, where it is meant to eliminate ignorance and lead to contentment and aid in the human quest towards the ultimate goal of salvation. The event saw a vibrant questions and answers session, after which, Dr. Kalyanee Rajan (Co-convenor, Carpe Diem) summarised the key points of the lecture, and Prof. Chhavi Sharma (Convenor, Carpe Diem) proposed the formal vote of thanks.



2. On 20 January 2025, the Department organized a guest lecture on “Professional and Business Communication: Strategies and Coping Mechanisms in the Digital Era” by eminent speaker Dr. Rohit Yadav, Department of English, Central University of Punjab. Dr. Rohit Yadav talked on the topic "Professional and Business Communication" focused on professional communication required for business professionals and students to meet job requirements. He also discussed strategies and coping mechanisms essential in the digital era. Dr. Yadav emphasized on the need for readiness of the students to deal with challenges in the digital landscape. The talk seemed very insightful for the audience with practical insights into effective communication practices personalised to modern business environments. IV. Department of Environmental Science

1. Field Visit to IIT Delhi – Centre for Rural development and Technology (CRDT). On 3rd July 2024, students of Geography honours Semester II visited the IIT Delhi Campus and the Centre for Rural Development and Technology. The students learnt about the key research areas of the CRDT namely Sustainable Biomass Production & Utilization, Food Processing, Safety & Quality, Sustainable Habitat & Green Solutions, Rural Energy Systems, Tools & Implements, Artisans & Livelihood, Environment & Climate Change, Rural Planning & Entrepreneurship Development, Water, Sanitation & Waste Management in Rural Areas and Bio economy Panchgavya.



2. Sustainability Talk Series: First guest lecture by Dr Samridhhi Rana, co- founder Jeevatma Foundation, 03 rd April 2025

The Department of EVS has started a sustainability talk series, with a goal of cultivating a deeper understanding of environmental, social, and economic interconnectedness and to illuminate pressing global challenges. By raising awareness and demystifying complex issues, these talks aim to inspire tangible action and engagement among the audience. They strive to motivate individuals and organizations to embrace more sustainable practices by showcasing practical solutions and empowering them with actionable steps. Ultimately, a sustainability talk seeks to foster a long-term, holistic mindset that values environmental stewardship and social responsibility, potentially driving innovation, enhancing reputations, informing policy, and building communities committed to a more sustainable and equitable future.

3. Field Visit to Daulat Ram College on Earth Day, 22nd April 2025

Students from various courses from the college took a visit to Daulat Ram College for an event organised by Panasonic India on Earth Day. Panasonic recently held an event called “Panasonic Harit Umang”; at Daulat Ram College, Delhi University, as part of their Earth Day celebrations. This event focused on promoting a zero-plastic ecosystem and aimed to break the Guinness World Record for the longest chain of plastic bags. Students from eight colleges participated, collecting an impressive 43,890 plastic bags. The collected bags were transformed into a chain for the record attempt. The students participated in various events and activities and showed a lot of enthusiasm in the sustainability and plastic reduction campaign. The idea is to implement a similar campaign in the SBSEC too.



4. Visit to Aravalli Biodiversity Park, 23rd April 2025

Students from various courses of the college participated in a field visit to Aravalli Biodiversity Park where they learnt about ecological restoration, showcasing the remarkable transformation of a degraded mining site into a flourishing ecosystem teeming with over 300 native plant species that support a rich diversity of wildlife, including numerous bird and butterfly species, as well as mammals. The park underscores the critical importance of conserving native biodiversity and demonstrates effective water management techniques like drip irrigation using treated greywater and rainwater harvesting, contributing to groundwater recharge in this urban setting. Functioning as a vital green lung, the park actively sequesters carbon and purifies the air, highlighting the essential role of urban green spaces. Furthermore, its development through collaborative efforts between citizens, NGOs, and the local authorities emphasizes the power of community involvement in conservation. As India's first recognized "Other Effective Area-based Conservation Measure" the Aravalli Biodiversity Park serves as a significant center for environmental education, illustrating the potential for revitalizing degraded lands and fostering a deep appreciation for the Aravalli ecosystem.

V. Department of Geography

Teacher in Charge – Prof. Anupama Verma

The Department of Geography, Shaheed Bhagat Singh Evening College, experienced an academically and socially fulfilling year in 2024-25. The department offers students avenues for skill acquisition, academic interaction, and extracurricular education through diverse activities, workshops, and events. The department was characterized by enthusiastic student participation, faculty mentorship, and collaborations with external institutions. The departmental society office bearers include President: Ankit Kumar, Vice Presidents: Somil Chilana and Arzoo Ahlawat, Secretaries: Rupam Roy and Ayushman Tiwari, and Joint Secretaries: Siddharth Kumar and

Milan Gandass. The students and faculty of the Department of Geography organised different activities and events in the 2024-2025 session; the following is a brief overview:

1. World Environment Day: The Geography Department Celebrated World Environment Day on 5th June 2024 with a forum discussion on ecological concerns, students' documentaries, and a tree plantation drive. The Department of Geography, SBSEC, had been certified by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) for joining the #GenerationRestoration movement through our event. The program attained its goal, creating awareness, promoting eco-friendliness, and engaging the students in protection activities for the greening of the future.
2. International Yoga Day: The Department of Geography celebrated the 10th International Day of Yoga on 21st June 2024. Guided by the spirit of "Yoga: Excellence in Action", the event embraced the theme "Yoga for Self and Society" (स्वयं और समाज के लिए योग). Organised with support from the Ministry of AYUSH and MyGov, the celebration promoted the values of harmony, peace, and community well-being through yoga practices.
3. Van Mahotsav: The Green Earth Initiative, on July 1- 7th, 2024, with the motto and theme “ एक पौधा माँ के नाम, Let's go green together”, conducted a tree-planting activity. The participants planted 520 saplings, and they participated in a workshop regarding sustainable gardening and composting.
4. Workshop on National Space Day: The department hosted a workshop on the theme "Touching Lives While Touching the Moon: India's Space Saga" on 23rd August 2024, featuring experts from ASIM Navigation India Pvt Ltd. The speakers, Dr. Pranay Kumar and Mr. Sumit Katyal, presented on geospatial technology, entrepreneurship, and GIS integration with drones. The workshop also included a poster exhibition on India's space exploration and geospatial developments.
5. Orientation Day: Shaheed Bhagat Singh Evening College's Department of Geography organised its Orientation Day for first-year students on 29 August 2025. Faculty presented the curriculum, departmental events, and research prospects. Academic resources, eco-club activities, and career opportunities were showcased, creating an interactive learning experience and inviting student involvement in geographical studies.
6. Celebration of Teachers' Day: The department hosted a heartfelt Teachers' Day celebration to honour faculty members on the evening of September 5, 2024. Students created a tribute video and shared their personal messages of gratitude.
7. Department Elections (Geography Association and SDC): The Department of Geography conducted its departmental elections for the session 2024-2025 to form the Geography Association and proceed smoothly through a nomination and voting process. The President was elected by ballot, while other positions were filled through nominations. The elections promoted student leadership, transparency, and active participation, ensuring effective departmental governance.
8. Swachhta Ki Pathshala: On 25th September 2024, the IQAC and Department of Geography, in collaboration with DRDO, organized "Swachhta Ki Pathshala" under the theme "Swabhav Swachhata - Sanskar Swachhata" as part of the Swachhata Hi Seva Campaign 2024. Scientists from DRDO introduced eco-friendly technologies and sanitation innovations. Students pledged to uphold cleanliness and promote sustainable practices at the individual and community levels.

9. Participation in Drone Expo: Students and staff members attended the Drone Expo from 26th to 28th September 2024 in the Yashobhoomi India International Convention and Expo Centre, where they had a stall displaying their projects and discussing the incorporation of drone technology into geography education. Faculty members gave presentations on incorporating drones into the education sector and received a certificate of appreciation on behalf of the Department of Geography, SBSEC.



10. Swachhata Hi Seva campaign: On 2nd October, the Geography Department conducted a Cleanliness Awareness March to instill hygiene and a clean environment, inspired by the Swachhata Hi Seva campaign. Faculty members, students, and the teacher in charge participated, creating awareness through banners and discussions regarding cleanliness. The event emphasised the need for personal responsibility for a cleaner campus.
11. Divyotsav Fest: The Sustainable Development Centre (SDC) engaged in the Divyotsav Fest with an interactive booth and an exhibition on sustainability on 23rd October 2024. Raising awareness through interactive games and exhibitions, SDC created awareness regarding environmental matters, encouraged eco-friendly practices, and brought education and an effective edge to the colourful cultural fest.



12. Drishti IAS Lecture on Civil Services: On 25 October 2024, Drishti IAS's Mr Prashant Sharma delivered a special lecture, enlightening students about career prospects in civil services and government exams. The session involved an interactive session on preparation strategy and the importance of geography in administrative services.
13. Workshop on GIS Day: GIS Day was celebrated on 20th November 2024 with a special online lecture by Dr Pankaj Kumar, Associate Professor from the Department of Geography of the Delhi School of Economics. Activities were a GIS exhibition, a map-making competition (Carto Craft), and open-source GIS technology and career opportunities discussions.
14. Field Visit IEW 25: The India Energy Week 2025, organised by FIPI and held from February 11 to 14 in Yashobhumi, Dwarka, New Delhi, had a field visit arranged by the SDC (Sustainable Development Centre) for the students. The event emphasised energy

security, innovation, investment, and international cooperation. Some key speakers included global energy leaders and India's Prime Minister. The students will learn about the latest developments in the energy sector of the world & in our nation, and how geographers contribute to different areas of the energy sector, like energy security.

15. Taramandal- Annual Geo Fest 2025: Shaheed Bhagat Singh Evening College, University of Delhi, Geography Department, organised its annual fest, Taramandal, on 28th March 2025 successfully. The fest consisted of a series of engaging activities such as quizzes, poster presentations, interactive workshops, and a guest lecture too. The lecture was given by the Chief Guest, Prof. Chirashree Ghosh, Head of Department, Department of Environmental Studies, on the topic of recent environmental issues of Delhi. One of the main attractions of the Taramandal fest was the release of the Annual magazine of the geography department "Nirdeshank" based on the theme "Targeting just & sustainable future: pathways for environment, people and prosperity". Students also actively took part in competitions such as BhuGyaan (Geography quiz), Snap Shrishti (photography competition), and Geo Pitch (policy presentation competition) on topics related to the environment. The Fest also showcased videos on achievements of departments as well as videos celebrating Mahakumbh and the astronauts' safe return of Sunita Williams and Butch Wilmore. The fest was further designed to foster geographical awareness as well as create creativity among people. With positive energy and constructive debates, Taramandal became both informative as well as enjoyable, making its mark on everybody who participated.



16. Educational Excursion: (a) The Department of Geography conducted an instructional Excursion for the 5th Semester, third-year students, along with faculty members, to the State of Himachal Pradesh from 13th to 20th August 2024. The excursion was conducted to impart to the student's fieldwork and techniques knowledge under the paper "DSC15: Fieldwork & Field Techniques in Geography". The students underwent a field report preparation guided by the faculty, which was entitled "A Geographical study of Himachal Pradesh", studying the environmental and socio-economic conditions. (b) The geography faculty conducted an educational tour to Sikkim for the 6th Semester students under the NEP Syllabus for the paper "DSC18: Disaster Management – Based Project Report" between 2nd and 9th March 2025. The students researched the Disaster impact, mitigation and preparedness in relation to the local geography. More than 50 students went to places like Nathula pass, Darjeeling and Gangtok in their research area.
17. Earth Day 2025: The Department of Geography celebrated Earth Day on 22nd April 2025 with a lecture by Dr. Sashikant Mishra, Scientist D in IMD, focusing on "Our Power, Our Planet." He highlighted India's advances in weather forecasting, including a

7-day forecast system, colour-coded early warnings, and satellite and radar technologies to strengthen disaster risk management.



18. Visit to IIPA (Indian Institute of Public Administration): On 24 and 25 April 2025, students of B.A. (Hons.) 


9. Annual Fest – Indradhanush 5.0 (12th April 2025)

The college library's extended hours, from 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM for the benefit of students, reflect its commitment to academic excellence by providing students and faculty with ample time and flexibility to engage in focused study and research. The library offers enhanced facilities, including Wi-Fi connectivity and access to a comprehensive catalogues and databases, for seamless digital access and CCTV surveillance to ensure a safe and secure environment. These additions have significantly improved the user experience, making the library a more accessible, efficient and secure space for independent study and collaborative learning. Shaheed Bhagat Singh Evening College Library keeps in track with research in the field of Library Science. The Library under the leadership of Prof. Poonam Chaudhary keeps on organizing lectures, workshops, and seminars throughout the year. One of the aims of our college library is to provide the right documents/Information to the right reader/user's at the right time. Throughout the academic year, the Library has been actively engaged in organizing various programs and initiatives aimed at enhancing the academic and research capabilities of both students and faculty. These efforts have included Orientations, Talks, and Lectures to ensure that the Library's resources and services are utilized to their fullest potential.

1. Orientation Programme for Ist Semester Students – Academic Year 2024–25

These chairs are specifically designed to cater to the needs of faculty members who often work late into the evening on research projects. This initiative reflects the library's dedication to providing a supportive and comfortable space for faculty members engaged in academic research. 


7. Building Blocks of startup success: Overcoming challenges and Achieving Milestones


8. Startup as an asset class: Transforming ideas into assets

Day 2: April 24, 2025 – PITCH-A-THON (Finale)


