The college has been accredited with 'A' Grade with a score of 3.6 by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Government of India in 2017 for 5 years.


Vision






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Principal's Message

Celebrated Birth Anniversary of Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan National Level Speech Competition





The celebration was very memorable for the college and participants. Through this, everyone got a chance to know and remember our great freedom fighters. It also gave students a big platform to present their art and ideas.









Shaheedi Diwas

The College organizes Shaheed Bhagat Singh Memorial Lecture on Martyrdom Day of Sardar Bhagat Singh on 23 March every year. In this lecture series, the college has invited in the past, speakers associated with the life and work of Shaheed Bhagat Singh. This year Padma Shri Jitender Singh Shunty was invited to motivate the students and staff of the college. Shri Jitender Singh is a Covid Worrier. He has been awarded Padma Shri in the category 'social work' for his relentless service for poor people for 25 years now and his contribution during COVID-19 by providing ambulances to ferry and cremate bodies.

Mr. Shunty shared that he was born in a poor family and lost his father at an early age. As a child, he witnessed multiple hardships and did odd jobs to make ends meet. In 1995, after his business picked up some momentum, Mr. Shunty started his own organisation 'Shaheed Bhagat Singh Sewa Dal'. The organisation was established with the objective of saving lives through promoting availability, accessibility and effectiveness of emergency services.

Talking about the idea behind serving people, Mr. Shunty said, "I am a follower of Bhagat Singh, who was executed at an age of 23. I belong to a (Sikh) community that believes in 'sewa' (service) and since childhood, we have heard, "Deh shiva bar mohe ihai, shubh karman te kabhun na taron, na doron ar syon jab jaye laron, nischay kar apni jeet karon" (O power of Akaal, give me this boon, may I never ever shirk from doing good deeds. That I shall not fear when I go into combat. And with determination I shall be victorious.)

Since the inception of Shaheed Bhagat Singh Sewa Dal, Mr. Shunty and his team have been taking care of the cremation of unclaimed bodies and those of poor people; providing ambulance service, mortuary box, hearse van. In the last 25 years, the team has cremated over 56,000 bodies.

The team stepped up even during the COVID-19 pandemic and worked for 18 hours at a stretch, given the enormity of the task at hand. In the last one and a half years of COVID-19, the team cremated 4,000 dead bodies. Talking about his motivation and the belief that kept him and his team going even when faced with extreme distress and disturbing circumstances, Mr. Shunty said, "People used to say that, 'you will die while serving people. It's an infectious disease, stay home.' But our religion says, "Muhi marne ka chao hai, maro ta har ke duar" (I long to die; let me die at the Lord's door.) I thought people are dying even at their homes so why not I continue with my service; I don't mind dying at the cremation ground."



To ensure the safety of his team and at the same time, assure that the COVID-19 warriors are at the top of their game, Mr. Shunty arranged for courses in first aid and dead body management for his frontline warriors.

Mr. Shunty said that the COVID-19 pandemic was an eye-opener for many as it showed the real face of people. Many found a family, a confidant in a stranger. While signing off, Mr. Shunty gave the message of preparing for the future and helping one and all. He said, During the pandemic, in many cases, even the family didn't come forward to perform the last rites. On contrary, strangers like you and me, came forward only to make us realize that everyone can be a protector. The one sitting on the borders, guarding the country, is not the sole protector.

While working on the frontlines, Mr. Shunty and his family tested positive for COVID-19 twice, he lost one of his ambulance drivers and even slept in a car, outside a cremation ground and sometimes in the parking area. But the passion to serve people kept the COVID-19 warrior and his team going.

With his inspiring and dedicated journey, he has motivated everyone to work for humanity selflessly. From the bottom of our hearts, we salute the covid warriors for there contribution in the fight of Covid-19. Their contribution will never be forgotten.







The college organized two-day 'Sports Fest 2K22' on 12-13 April 2022. It saw a massive participation of students from not only the college but from all over the University. The first day included of various competitions like long jump, 100m Race, 200m Race, Mix-Relay Race, Volleyball and Tug-of-war(s) etc. for boys, girls, and college staff. The competitions were held in three-phase trials, semi-final and finals. On the second day Padma Shree awardee Shri Yogeshwar Dutt was invited as Chief Guest. Sh. Shri Yogeshwar Dutt inspired the professors and students with his words of wisdom. Shri Dutt (born 2 November 1982) is an Indian freestyle wrestler. He was awarded the Padma Shri by the Government of India in 2013. He had won gold medals at the 2010 and the 2014 Commonwealth Games.

In his opening remarks, Shri Dutt described how he had been inspired by the dedication and commitment of Shaheed Bhagat Singh for the country. He urged the youth to think how their actions can help in the betterment of the nation and society regardless of the field they decide to pursue. He asked the youth to be honest towards their work and country and contribute to the nation's pride. He also emphasized on giving respect to parents, teachers and



every creature. Hard work and passion are the key to success and winning and losing are part of life. One must always learn from one's failures, he said.

International Webinar

The Undercover Economist:



Main Round:


The top 10 participants who made it to the main round, were required to act as an economist they chose (out of the given list of economists), in accordance with the topic allotted to them.

National Young Economists Conclave (NYEC) 2022

The Department of Economics, Shaheed Bhagat Singh Evening College, organized the fifth edition of the National Young Economists Conclave (NYEC) on the 3-4 March 2022. The main objective of the conclave was to provide undergraduate students with a platform to showcase their research skills and analytical views on economic issues. Undergraduate students of all recognized universities and institutions across India are invited to submit original research papers and present them on the themes relevant to the conclave.

There were a total of 3 rounds – In the first round, the participants had to submit the abstract of their research paper. We received approximately 213 abstracts from all over India. The participants had to submit their full research papers for the second round. Based on the quality of the research paper, the participants got selected for the third, i.e., the final round of the conclave. After a rigorous selection round, only 43 articles were shortlisted for the final round. 

Webinar by Dr. Debal Deb (Founder and Chair, Centre for Interdisciplinary Studies, Kolkata)


The Economics Department organized a Webinar on "Sustainable Food Production systems: Agroecological models from indigenous farmers" on the 8 April 2022.


In the previous year (2021-22) the Department of History organised several activities in the college:





- A Certificate Course in Historical Tourism has been proposed by the Department of History under consideration for academic excellence.



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Department of Political Science


Under the guidance of its teachers and Teacherin-Charge, **Ms. Kirti Singh** the department held various academic and non-academic events throughout the year. This year too, numerous conferences, seminars, workshops, interactive sessions and inter and intra-college competitions were organised. Some major highlights of the year are:



** On 24 June 2021, the Department of Political Science in collaboration with the Academic Affairs Committee of the college organised a webinar on "Mental Health Challenges and the Pandemic" with Dr. Shankar Chowdhury, former senior programme manager, UNESCO and Dr. Hiba Siddiqui, Senior Psycho-Oncologist Max Healthcare, to discuss mental health problems that the people were facing in the lockdown due to the pandemic. The session was attended by over 90 participants. The speakers discussed about on how to maintain a good health not only physically but mentally as well. There was an amazing response from the participants, with as many as 60 people all across the university participating in the competitions.



❖Knowledge Book


















National Service Scheme

Date: 22 – 23 January 2022







NSS Union 2021-2022



Even today, the cultural and social influences create a major hurdle in ensuring that adolescent girls get proper Knowledge on menstrual hygiene.

High illiteracy, poverty, and lack of awareness about menstrual health and hygiene are the main reasons for this taboo.

To break the silence and to spread awareness, the NSS Unit, organized a seminar on the menstrual hygiene and women's health under the aegis of "Project Laali -शर्म नहीं, सुरक्षा" on 11 April.

3. NESDU Sports 2022







Reflection - The Photograph






New Session














Sangharsh: The Dramatics Society

4-day Intensive Theatre Workshop



Sangh-kriti: The Intercultural Society



We also work in order to guide the students in developing skills and job-search strategies required to achieve their career objectives. The Placement Cell is guided with the constant support of their Convenor Mr. Sunder Singh & Co-Convenor Dr. Amrita Kaur along with the Student President of the cell Ms. Shruti Rani.

The Placement Cell provides the perfect mix of professional & personal development. It enhances your networks, body language, confidence, communication skills and your perspective towards day-to-day tasks with a better clarity of the corporates. Students from all courses of 1st Year & 2nd Year are welcomed to be a part of The Placement Cell every year. We believe that trust and loyalty can be built and groomed only over a period of time. The students have to appear for the tedious selection process criteria and only a handful of them are taken in every year. The selection ratio of the Cell is approximately 1:40 i.e., for every 40 students, 1 student is selected. This is enough to justify the standard of work that has to be delivered and the importance of the work that The Placement Cell is committed to.




Events organized by SBSEC Library

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
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

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लेकिन बत्तीसवें सावन ने जीने के दृष्टिकोण को ही बदल दिया-अध्ययात्म की ओर। पहले मंजिल की ओर बेतहाशा दौड़ रहा था, अब ठहराव आ गया। जीवन के मायने बदल गए और दुनिया की दौड बेमानी लगने लगी। जीने का एक नया मंत्र मिला –

मंजिल मिले ना मिले, गिला नहीं, ये क्या कम है कि तुम मेरे साथ-साथ हो।

शादी के कुछ महीनों बाद ही मेरी पत्नी मुझे अपने धर्मस्थल ले गई-शुक्रिया अदा करने। पता नहीं था कि यही दरबार मेरा धर्मस्थल और कर्मस्थल क्षेत्र बन जाएगा। दरबार में पहली बार जब मैं गया तो यह कव्वाली सुनकर यह लगा कि मैं भाग्यशाली हूँ -


मुझे आपने बुलाया, मेरा मर्तबा बढ़ाया, ये तेरा करम नहीं तो और क्या है।

दरबार में सैकड़ों लोगों को भाव विहल हो कर एक खूबसूरत कशिश से भरा शिकायत करते सुना

क्यों आँख लड़ाई थी, क्यों आग लगाई थी, अब खुद ही पर्दानशी हो बैठे, मुझको दीवाना बना के।

भाव विहल हुए हजारों के हुजूम को जब मैंने अपने बाबा, अपने भगवान का कदमबोसी करते देखा तो मन में स्वतः ही ये शब्द पल्लवित हो गए-

मंजिल मेरे बीते हुए लम्हों को ढूंढ़ती है, और मेरे कदमों के निशान को जहाँ चूमती है।



और फिर शुरू हुआ मेरा, मेरे बाबा, और उस दरबार से मोहब्बत का सिलसिला। पता ही नहीं लगा कब रब से बेपनाह मोहब्बत हो गयी। गालिब का यह शेर पढ़ा और सुना तो बहुत था पर उसे मायने तब मिला जब मुझे पता ही नहीं लगा कि कब मैं रब का हो गया-

> इश्क पर ज़ोर नहीं गालिब, ये वो आतिश है, जो लगाए ना लगे, बुझाए न बुझे। और

गोरी गोरी बैयाँ, हरी-हरी चूड़ियाँ, हरी- हरी चूड़ियाँ, गोरी-गोरी बैयाँ, बैयाँ पकड़ हर लीनी, मोसे नैना मिला के।

यह धुन मुझे डूबोता गया इश्क की गहराईयों में और फिर खुसरों की इन पंक्तियों का अर्थ समझ आया-

खुसरो दरिया प्रेम की, वाकी उल्टी धार, जो पार हुआ सो डूब गया, जो डूब गया सो पार।

और जब इस राह पर चलने लगा तो चुनौतियाँ भी बहुत मिली। कई इम्तिहानों से गुजरने लगा। मस्ती का आलम तो मिला ही लेकिन यह भी जता दिया गया-

> ये इश्क नहीं आसान, बस इतना ही समझ लीजै, इक आग का दरिया है और डूब कर जाना है।



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और इस तरह शुरू हुआ, मेरा मेरे बाबा से मोहब्बत का सिलसिला या यूँ कहिये - "मैं" से "मैं" विहीन होने का बहुत ही कठिन और नायाब सफर। जैसे-जैसे आगे बढ़ा, लगता गया-

"बहुत कठिन है डगर पनघट की"

बाबा ने प्रेरणा भी दी, उत्साहित भी किया साथ ही मुझे इन पांक्तियों का आभास भी कराया गया -

मुझे आईना देखने का और खुद को निहारने का बहुत शौक था। एक दिन खुद को निहार रहा था, तो एकाएक आइने में बाबा दिख गए, और फिर बाबा की शक्त में खुद का शक्त दिख गया।

मेरे बाबा ने मुझे शिक्षा और दीक्षा दी- "तन मन एक हो"। और मैं अपने गुरु से यह इल्तज़ा करने लगा-

ऐ मेरे पीर भ्रम मेरा ये बनाए, मैं तेरा हूँ यकीन ये दिलाये रखना।

हैरानी भी हो रही थी कि जिस राह का कोई अता पता नहीं, कैसे मस्ती के आलम में उस अंजाने डगर पर बेखीफ बढ़ा जा रहा हूँ-

ना जानू आरती बंदन, ना ही पूजा की रीत, ये तेरा करम है मेरे बाबा,जो बात अब तक बनी हुई है।

बत्तीसवें साल में जीवन 360° पर घूम गई। सोलह से बत्तीस तक भौतिकतावाद की प्रधानता रही। माता की धर्मिकता और पिता की कर्मठता साथ-साथ चली। बचपन से शिव मेरे इष्ट देव रहे हैं - विशेषकर शिव का औघड़ दानी स्वरूप। साथ मे कर्ण - महाभारत के अहम व्यक्तित्व की दानप्रियता से प्रभावित रहा था। सोलह सें बत्तीस के दौरान रोज़ सुबह मेरे कमरे पर दरबार लगता था। मेरे सोकर उठने से पहले पाँच-दस लोग विराजमान रहते थें। मुझे खुशी है मेरे दरबार में जो आया कोई भी खाली हाथ नहीं गया। सैकड़ों की झोली में कुछ ना कुछ गिरा। हालांकि इस प्रक्रिया में मेरा सब कुछ सांसारिक अर्जित, मेरा नहीं रहा। पर मुझे अत्यंत हर्ष है कि ऊपर वाले ने सैकड़ों लोगों की समस्या के समाधान का माध्यम मुझे बनाया। उनके माध्यम बनने से ज्यादा खुशिकरमती क्या हो सकती है। औघड़ दानी शिव का भक्त भी मैं था सो जिस पर मन प्रसन्न हुआ अपना सब कुछ न्यौछावर करदिया।

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और शिव से ही प्रभावित मेरे आग्रह के बावजूद यदि कोई रास्ते का रोड़ा बना तो जिस तरह डाइनामाइट विस्फोट से चट्टान उड़ाई जाती है उसी तरह रास्ते के रोड़े को भी उड़ा दिया। जहाँ दोस्तों के लिए जान -हाज़िर थी, वहीं दुश्मनों के लिए खौफ़ था।

बतीसवें साल से यह सब बदलने लगा। जो पहले से जानते थे उन्हें आश्चर्य था कि सांसारिक दौड़ में इतना सफल होने के बाद दौड़ से कैसे हट गया। जो बाद में जीवन में मिले, उनमें कईयों को मैं एक हारा हुआ व्यक्ति लगा। मन कई बार कहता था कि इन्हें कह दूँ कि "जीती हुई बाज़ी थी, मैंने जानकर हारी थी।" पर नहीं कहा क्योंकि जो जीवन में महत्वपूर्ण नहीं उनमें कैसा उलझना। कुछ नए लोग जो जीवन में आए उन्होंने कमज़ोर समझ लिया। जिस नाम से दुश्मन थरीते थे आज उसी पर कमजोर और बलहीन- आक्रमण करने लगे। वाह रे समय चक्र। कईयों ने, बदनाम करने की कोशिश की। मैंने जवाबी हमला की सोची तो मेरे बाबा ने मुझे रोक लिया। कहा अब जब तुम मेरे हो गए तो जवाब मैं दूंगा और उचित समय पर दूँगा। और जिस्म पर लोगों ने अनिगनत चोट और जल्म दिए लेकिन मेरे बाबा का करम कि जिस्म जल्म से भरा था लेकिन कहीं दर्द नहीं:

ए नमक पाश तुझे तेरी मलाहत की कसम, मजा तो तब है जब हर जख्म नमकसार हो जाए।

समय के साथ मैंने अपने बाबा का करम भी देख लिया। जिस जिसने मुझे चोट पहुँचाने की कोशिश की, एक-एक कर सबको बर्बाद होते देखा। मन में यह ख़्याल पल्लवित हुआ-

> शीशे का मकान जो मैंने बनाया, जमाने के हाथों ने लाख पत्थर मारा, हर पत्थर को शीशे से टकरा चूर होता पाया, ये तेरा करम नहीं तो और क्या है।

सोलह का पहाड़ा मेरे जीवन में बहुत महत्त्वपूर्ण रहा है। सोलह और बत्तीस का सावन जब अपना-अपना नशा दे चुका था तो अड़तालीसवाँ क्यों कम रहता। अड़तालीसवाँ सावन कयामत का सावन निकला। संपूर्ण अस्तित्व हिल गया। पूरी दुनिया दुश्मन बन गई। संकट के बादलों ने जीवन को चारों ओर से घेर लिया। बाबा ने आभास कराया। धैर्य रखो,सब ठीक हो जाएगा। आज महसूस होता है यह समय मेरे धैर्य और विश्वास की परीक्षा थी।

Dynamics of Russia-Central Asia Relation Amidst Ukrainian Crisis

Russia's role in Asian geopolitics is significant. Moscow is an economic partner, a military leader, and a weapons supplier for Asian countries. However, the Ukraine conflict has revealed that opinions toward the Kremlin vary greatly throughout the region. In early March 2022, the United Nations General Assembly condemned Russia by a vote of 141 to 4, with 35 nations abstaining. Among them were Armenia, Bangladesh, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Laos, Mongolia, Pakistan, and Vietnam, as well as China and India. Azerbaijan, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan were among the 12 countries that did not vote. Each Asian country views the invasion of Ukraine through the lens of its relationship with Russia.

Each Asian country views the Russia's military operations in Ukraine through the lens of its relationship with Moscow. Russian Federation is a major commercial partner or investor for various countries. Others believe that Russian-speaking minority constitute a sizable proportion of the population. Moscow is a significant arms exporter and, at times, a military model to emulate. Other variables, like ties with China and the West, also have a role to put Moscow is a favorable geopolitical position in Asia.


Almost all Central Asian nations avoided denouncing Russia at the United Nations. It is practicality, not ideology that binds these countries to Moscow. The Kremlin regards these countries as crucial to its own security. A western narrative that any

reaction might place these countries in a position similar to Ukraine has been circulating since Russia started its military operation in Ukraine. However, this seems irrational as Russia-Central Asia relations are based on long-term strategic ties. Furthermore, all Central Asian nations have Russian-speaking populations as well as strong economic and political links to the Kremlin. Some of these countries are members of the Eurasian Economic Union, which is governed by Russia. These countries also consider their alliance with Russia as a tool for countering Chinese dominance. Moscow

and Beijing are fighting for influence in Central Asia. The region's countries have a strategic interest in balancing the two, thus they cooperate with Russia.



Impact of Ukrainian Conflict on Central Asia

The ongoing conflict between Ukraine and Russia will have an immediate impact on Central Asian countries. Although the Central Asian nations have adopted a neutral posture in the war, the leaders of Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, and Kyrgyzstan spoke on the phone with Putin when Moscow started a special military operation in Ukraine on February 24, 2022. As a result, the United States and other Western countries have taken serious efforts to limit imposing tough economic economic capabilities, Moscow's sanctions. It will have a significant influence on the economies of Central Asia. Remittances from migrant workers in Russia account for a sizable amount of Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan's GDP. Following Russia's annexation of Crimea in 2014, economic restrictions were imposed, affecting Central Asia as well. It is much more crucial at this point because of the Central Asian are still struggling to overcome the economic damages created by Covid-19 pandemic.

The conflict between Russia and Ukraine will have economic and geopolitical ramifications for the Central Asian region.

Economic Impact

Russia is one of Central Asia's most important commercial partners. Kazakhstan and Kyrgyzstan are members of the Eurasian Economic Union (EAEU), which is governed by Russia, while Uzbekistan is an observer. By the end of 2021, the EAEU's foreign commerce had

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expanded by more than 34%, while internal trade had increased by 67%. This is a positive indicator for the Eurasian Union's growing trade and economic ties. The total GDP growth rate was 4.4 percent, which was significantly higher than expected. Russia's economic sanctions would have a severe influence on the Eurasian Economic Union's external and internal commerce. The EAEU members held an emergency meeting to discuss the measures to minimize the impact of the economic sanctions against Russia which will also impact other EUEU members.

Furthermore, Central Asian labour migrants in Russia make considerable contributions to their home countries' economy. According to the Russian Ministry of Internal Affairs, over 3 million migrant workers from Uzbekistan, over 1.6 million from Tajikistan, and 620,000 from Kyrgyzstan entered Russia between January and September 2021. Furthermore, remittances, particularly from Russia, make for 30% of Tajikistan's GDP, 28% of Kyrgyzstan's GDP, and roughly 12% of Uzbekistan's GDP. With the introduction of sanctions by the United States, the United Kingdom, and other European nations, the Ruble has begun to fall, lowering the value of migrant workers' earnings and savings. The national currencies of Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, and Uzbekistan all experienced similar devaluation.



Geopolitical Impact

Russia's role in quelling the demonstrations in Kazakhstan in January 2022 is typically regarded through the perspective of an enlarged and strong Russian influence in the region. As a result, geopolitical concerns about Russia's intrusive activities in the context of the Ukraine conflict have reverberated throughout Central Asia. As a result, no Central Asian countries have spoken out in support of Russia's activities in Ukraine. The Central Asian

leaders have also not condemned Russia's military actions in Ukraine. It should be underlined that Russia will neither take Kazakhstan nor capture Bishkek or Tashkent. Moscow, on the other hand, maintains military outposts in Central Asia and is continuously looking for opportunities to use crises and societal factionalism for geopolitical gain.

Conclusion

The war between Russia and Ukraine has once again left Central Asian countries in a difficult position. For the time being, they have refrained from making big statements, but the consequences of this crisis will have a long-term impact on the region. Central Asian leaders may be cautious of Moscow's efforts as a result of the alarming situation that this crisis has created. This might, on the other hand, contribute to a strengthening of Russia-Central Asian relations. Therefore, it is far too early to make any predictions regarding the future of Russia-Central Asia ties. For Moscow, ensuring the economic well-being and security of its Central Asian neighbours will become increasingly crucial. The CSTO and the EAEU will be viewed in higher respect than they have ever been. Furthermore, this circumstance will promote regional collaboration, which has just taken a favourable turn.
